

General Rules Governing All Exhibits at the Wylie Show and Sale

GENERAL RULES

1. The show will be open to all FFA members who are regularly enrolled in an Agriculture science class within the Wylie Independent School District, who are in good standing with the chapter, and have paid all FFA dues. Junior FFA members can participate if they have paid all FFA dues to the Wylie FFA and are in good standing with the chapter. East Fork 4-H members may participate if they have paid all 4-H dues, who are in good standing with East Fork 4-H, and live within the Wylie ISD school boundaries.
2. Validation for the Wylie Show and Sale will be set by the agriculture teachers and will be a requirement to show. This validation will include any steers, swine, lambs, and goats. Validation will be held at the Wylie FFA Ag Barn or at a facility at the discretion of Ag Teachers. All market sheep, goats, pigs, and steers will be Texas Major Show Validated in order to show. The Texas Validation Tag or Collin County Tag must be in the child's name or the child's sibling's name to exhibit the animal.
(Exception for East Fork 4-H members for 2014 who did not Major Show Validate. Validation date is January 15, 2014)
3. A copy of breeding animal papers must be turned in to the Ag Science Teacher by date specified by teachers. If they are not on file, you will not enter that animal in the breeding show. You must have registered breeding papers or must fill out the breeding paper that is attached to the rules.
4. All exhibitors may enter as many animals as wanted, but are only eligible to sale one animal in the live auction.
5. All entrants must adhere to the Wylie ISD school policies.
6. Entrants must be attending school: public (WISD), private, or home school. A student enrolled in DAEP second semester will be ineligible to show. You must be at a public, private or home school of WISD the six weeks prior to the show and sale. (Entrants from an alternative behavioral school may not participate in this livestock show.)
7. The exhibitor must own all market animals by validation date and by specified date for all breeding animals.
8. All animals and birds shown must be free of disease, in good health, and well groomed.
9. The owner must show all entries unless an Agriculture Science Teacher has granted permission otherwise. Substitutions can only be made if the exhibitor is ill or hospitalized. If an exhibitor does not meet UIL rules, the animal will not show.
10. Exhibitors of market steers, lambs, goats, and pigs must show the animals they validated at the given dates for validation. Exhibitors of poultry (broilers and turkeys) must have purchased them through Wylie FFA and East Fork 4-H. All poultry shown must be wing banded.
11. Judging will be done by competent judges whose decision will be final. The judge's decision cannot be disputed.

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12. If an exhibitor is not present when his or her animal is to be shown, the animal will be disqualified unless prior arrangements have been made with the Ag Science Teachers.
13. All pens, stalls, and aisles must be kept clean during the entire show.
14. No exhibitors will be allowed on the show grounds between the hours of 12 midnight and 5:00 AM each day. (Exception: Show is not complete during these hours)
15. An entrant that is involved in disorderly conduct as describe in the Wylie ISD code of conduct will be disqualified. This includes all projects exhibited by that exhibitor. The project and exhibitor must be removed immediately.
16. Any unethical treatment to an animal will not be tolerated. Students may be disqualified or barred from future shows.
17. Random animal drug testing may be performed, if felt necessary by the Ag Advisors or the 4-H Leaders.
18. The Wylie FFA, Wylie FFA Supporter Club, and the East Fork 4-H will not be responsible for any damage or loss to persons or property during the show.
19. Failure on the part of the exhibitor to obey all rules and regulations or to interfere with the judges shall result in the forfeit his/her privileges to show and sale. This exhibitor must remove his/her animal from the show facility immediately.
20. There will be four Divisions to the Wylie Show and Sale:
 - Animal division
 - Food division
 - Horticulture division
 - Shop Project division
21. Each exhibitor will only be allowed to have two entries in the live auction. These two entries must come from two different divisions.
24. A \$25.00 fee will be assessed for those not helping with cleanup and/or set-up.

ANIMAL DIVISION

MARKET LAMB DIVISION

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
3. Each exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his or her own animal and pen.
4. Sale market lamb class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
5. Wethers and open ewe lambs may be shown in the market class with a minimum weight of 90 pounds and no maximum weight with a five pound tolerance for the minimum weight.
6. All lambs will be slick sheared above the knees and hocks.
7. Market lambs will be broken according to weights.
8. Animals can not be entered in both the market class and the breeding class.
9. All market lambs will be validated on set date by the agriculture teachers.
10. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Grand Champion Overall must sell in the live auction. You will not be allowed to pull one of these animals out of the sale. Exception – If the same exhibitor has Grand and Reserve Overall – the lower placing of the two must be pulled from the sale.

MARKET MEAT GOAT DIVISION

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
3. Each exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his or her own animal and pen.
4. Sale market goat class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
5. Wethers and open female goats may be entered in the market class.
6. Animals can not be entered in both the market class and the breeding class.
7. Goats must weigh a minimum of 70 pounds no maximum with a five pound tolerance at the minimum weight.
8. Market goats must be slick shorn above the knees and hocks.
9. Market goats must be dehorned or have their horns tipped.
10. Market goat classes will be divided into three weight classes according to weight.
11. All market goats will be validated on set date by the agriculture teachers.
12. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Grand Champion Overall must sell in the live auction. You will not be allowed to pull one of these animals out of the sale. Exception – If the same exhibitor has Grand and Reserve Overall – the lower placing of the two must be pulled from the sale.
13. A sale order will determine sale slots for each exhibitor.

MARKET SWINE DIVISION

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
3. Each exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his or her own animal and pen.
4. Sale market swine class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
5. Barrows and open gilts may be entered as market swine.
6. Market swine must weigh a minimum of 230 pounds and no maximum weight, one weigh back within one hour of start of weigh in.
7. The market swine will be broken into weight classes.
8. Animals can not be entered in both the market class and the breeding class.
9. All market swine will be validated on set date by the agriculture teachers.
10. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Grand Champion Overall must sell in the live auction. You will not be allowed to pull one of these animals out of the sale. Exception – If the same exhibitor has Grand and Reserve Overall – the lower placing of the two must be pulled from the sale.
11. A sale order will determine sale slots for each exhibitor.

MARKET RABBIT DIVISION

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Sale market rabbit class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
4. Each exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his or her own animal and pen.
5. Meat pen rabbits shall consists of three rabbits, either sex, weighing between 3 to 5 pounds each. All rabbits in a pen shall be from the same breed.
6. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Grand Champion Overall must sell in the live auction. You will not be allowed to pull one of these animals out of the sale. Exception – If the same exhibitor has Grand and Reserve Overall – the lower placing of the two must be pulled from the sale.
7. Breeding dates for meat pens are January 4, 2013 to February 1, 2014.
8. The rabbit show will be a carrying cage show.
9. Exhibitors that show meat pen rabbits will be allowed to bring a maximum of 5 rabbits to the show to select 3. The extra two are to be removed from the judging immediately.
10. Meat pen rabbits must be tattooed on date given by Ag teacher at Wylie High School. (5 weeks prior to show)

MARKET STEER DIVISION

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.

2. Sale market steer class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
4. Each exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his or her own animal and pen.
5. Market steers must weigh a minimum of 1000 pounds, to compete in the market steer class.
6. Steers will be broken into weight classes.
7. All steers must be halter broken and shown unassisted. This rule should be clarified as follows: If a steer breaks away from the exhibitor twice without being provoked the steer will be disqualified. No unruly steers will be tolerated.
8. All market steers will be pre-clipped to no more than ¼” of hair, on any part of the body except the tail switch. Steers will be checked for hair length at the time of weigh-in.
9. No spray painting or oils will be allowed. Water only.
10. All market steers must be validated with a Texas Validation Tag or a Wylie Validation Tag. If this tag is not visible in the steer’s ear, you will not be eligible to show.
11. All market steers will be validated on set date by the agriculture teachers.
12. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Grand Champion Overall must sell in the live auction. You will not be allowed to pull one of these animals out of the sale. Exception – If the same exhibitor has Grand and Reserve Overall – the lower placing of the two must be pulled from the sale.
13. Placing will determine sale order.

MARKET BROILERS

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Sale market broiler class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. All broilers shown must be ordered through the Wylie FFA or East Fork 4-H Club.
4. The broilers exhibited must be validated in the exhibitor’s name. (wing band validation)
5. The broilers must have an intact wing band to be eligible to show. The original purchaser is the only one eligible to exhibit these broilers.
6. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
7. Broilers must be shown in a pen of three meat birds.
8. Exhibitors may enter more than one pen of birds, but may only sale one.
9. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Grand Champion Overall must sell in the live auction. You will not be allowed to pull one of these animals out of the sale. Exception – If the same exhibitor has Grand and Reserve Overall – the lower placing of the two must be pulled from the sale.

BREEDING BEEF HEIFERS

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Breeding heifer class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. This division is limited to females only.
4. Animals will be judged according to the following classes:
 - American
 - British
 - Exotic
5. Heifers are to be fed and watered by the owner.
6. All heifers must be halter broken and shown unassisted. This rule should be clarified as follows: If a heifer breaks away from the exhibitor twice without being provoked the heifer will be disqualified. No unruly heifer will be tolerated.
7. Cattle cannot have hair or simulated hair attached to their body by any artificial means to change the natural confirmation. The hair color may not be altered in any way. These changes will disqualify the animal and exhibitor from the show. The animals are not to have any coloring on them that will rub off on the hands of the judge.
8. To be eligible to show in the Wylie Show and Sale, the exhibitor must own the heifer, and have papers transferred into the students name by specified date. (Nov 1)
9. The Ag Science teacher must have a copy of the registration papers on file by same specified date.
10. If the exhibitor has more than one entry they may substitute an exhibitor.
11. This is a blow and show; no adhesives.

BREEDING EWES (LAMBS)

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Breeding ewe class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. This division is limited to females only.
4. Ewes are to be fed and watered by the owner.
5. All breeding ewes will be shown by age in the following classes:

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- 0 to 2 years old
 - 3 to 5 years old
- **Age will be determined by the registration breeding papers.
6. Breeding animals must be owned by date specified by Agriculture teachers.
 7. The Ag Science teacher must have a copy of the breeding papers on file by specified date.
 8. The breeding ewe must be shown by the exhibitor on the registration paper that is turned in to the Ag Science teacher.
 9. If the exhibitor has more than one entry they may substitute an exhibitor.

BREEDING NANNIES (GOATS)

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Breeding nanny class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. This division is limited to females only.
4. Nannies are to be fed and watered by the owner.
5. All breeding ewes will be shown by age in the following classes:
 - 0 to 2 years old
 - 3 to 5 years old**Age will be determined by the registration breeding papers.
6. Breeding animals must be owned by Agriculture science appointed date.
7. The Ag Science teacher must have a copy of the breeding papers on file by specified date.
8. The breeding nanny must be shown by the exhibitor on the registration paper that is turned in to the Ag Science teacher.
9. If the exhibitor has more than one entry they may substitute an exhibitor.

BREEDING SWINE

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Breeding gilt class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H.
3. This division is limited to females only.
4. Gilts are to be fed and watered by the owner.
5. All breeding gilts will be shown together in one class.
6. Only gilts are allowed in this show, no sows (already had litter) can be shown.
7. Breeding animals must be owned by specified date.

8. The Ag Science Teacher must have a copy of the breeding papers on file by specified date.
9. The breeding gilt must be shown by the exhibitor on the registration paper that is turned in to the Ag Science Teacher.
10. If the exhibitor has more than one entry they may substitute and exhibitor.
11. All female pigs that do not make weight will be classed in a light weight commercial and/or heavy weight commercial and will show against class winners in breeding show for champion and reserve champ breeding swine.

BREEDING RABBITS

1. All general rules apply in addition to the rules in this division.
2. Breeding rabbit class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H members.
3. The exhibitor must furnish all feed, containers and water buckets.
4. Each exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his or her own animal and pen.
5. This division is for does and bucks only.
6. The rabbit show will be a carrying cage show.
7. Breeding animals must be owned by specified date.
8. The Ag Science Teacher must have a copy of the breeding papers on file by specified date.
9. Breeding rabbits will be shown in the following class:
 - Junior Buck
 - Junior Doe
 - Senior Buck
 - Senior Doe
10. The Best of Show and Best of Opposite will be chosen from the winners of the four classes.
11. The breeding rabbit must be shown by the exhibitor on the registration paper that is turned in to the Ag Science teacher.
12. If the exhibitor has more than one entry they may substitute an exhibitor.

FOOD DIVISION

FOOD

1. Food division class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H members.
2. For judging purposes, three (3) typed or printed copies of a recipe must accompany all food entries with one 5" X 7" recipe card attached to each item. The name of the recipe must be on the front of the card and exhibitor name on the back of the card. All food is judged on appearance, color, texture, and flavor and scrap book.
3. Entries will be displayed on disposable plates and covered with a see through top (plastic wraps securely fastened, commercial plastic, etc.). Absolutely no containers will be returned.
4. All food entries must not require refrigeration.
5. A display of small items such as cookies must contain a minimum of two (2) dozen items.
6. Muffins or Cupcakes must contain a minimum of one dozen items.
7. The Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion will make the live auction. They will be required to make fresh food for the auction. It is the student's responsibility to find out whether or not they will be in the live auction. There will be a total of two food entries sold in the live auction.
8. Classes are as follows:
 - Cookies: brownies, bar cookies, drop, refrigerated, rolled, cut out, etc.
 - Cakes: layered, cup cakes, bundt, etc.
 - Pies: fruit or doubled crust (no refrigeration needed).
 - Breads: muffins, coffeecakes, loaf and etc.(no prepackaged bread)
 - Candy: hard candy, brittles, fudge
9. Entries will be judge in each class and the 1st place entries will compete for Grand Champion and 2nd place from Champion class will compete for Reserve Grand Champion honors. There will be two food items in the auction.
10. All other food items not making the live auction must be picked up by 8 p.m. on April 9, 2014. If not picked up, they will discarded.
11. A \$25.00 fee will be assessed for those not helping with cleanup.
12. Scrap book will include minimum of five pictures and a price breakdown of supplies (how much did it cost you to make the item)

HORTICULTURE DIVISION

HORTICULTURE

1. Horticulture division class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members, and East Fork 4-H members.
2. Judging criteria in the following: scrapbook; balance, general eye appeal.
3. Baskets or containers are to be new and not decorated except for class 3.
4. Scrap book will include minimum of five pictures and a price breakdown of supplies (how much did it cost you to make the item)
5. All entries must be of a size no larger than the exhibitor is able to hand carry into the exhibit hall. If the project does not meet this requirement, it will be disqualified from the show.
6. The horticultural projects will be judged in the following classes:
 - Arrangements – silk flower container arrangements(containers cannot be altered)
 - Decorative Containers – container will be judged – must be handcrafted
 - Wreaths and Topiaries - - silk flowers
13. There will be a first place in each class. The first place winners will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion.
14. The Grand Champion and 2nd place from Champion class will compete for the Reserve Grand Champion will make the live auction. Therefore, there will be two horticulture projects in the live auction.
15. All arrangements must be made from artificial materials and may not contain any live materials.
15. A \$25.00 fee will be assessed for those not helping with cleanup.

SHOP PROJECT DIVISION

SHOP PROJECTS

1. Shop Project division class entries are confined to Wylie ISD FFA members, Wylie ISD Junior FFA members and East Fork 4-H members.
2. Judging criteria is the following: scrap book, aesthetics, originality, mechanical and craftsmanship.
3. All shop projects must be completed by the exhibitor that is entering the project.
4. A diary with pictures must accompany all entries. A minimum of ten (10) photos showing different stages of the project must be included. It should also include a blue print/working drawing and bill of materials.
5. Shop projects will be entered in the following categories:
 - Wood Projects
 - Metal Projects
 - Combo projects (metal and wood)
6. The Grand Champion Overall and Reserve Champion Overall will make the live auction. There will be a Grand Champion and 2nd place from Champion class will compete for Reserve Champion in each category and these will compete for overall champion and reserve. Therefore, two shop projects will make the live auction.
7. Mechanic projects can be pulled but we will sale two projects.
8. You must note on entry card if the project is a joint project and if it is a sale item.
9. A \$25.00 fee will be assessed for those not helping with cleanup.

Tractor Restoration Division

No lawn or garden tractors allowed. No implements or non-factory accessories allowed. Batteries must be disconnected and cranking or ignition systems must be disabled on all tractors to prevent unauthorized starting while on display. All fuel tank caps are to be placed and sealed with tape. All tractors will be exhibited outdoors.

Criteria:	Points
Aesthetics	20
Originality	10
Mechanical	50
Safety Equipment	10
Documentation	10

Ribbons will be awarded as follows: Blue, Red and White
Grand and Reserve champions receiving a belt buckle.

Aesthetics is to include overall appearance of tractor. This includes workmanship and finish. Items to be considered include but are not limited to: metal preparation,

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completeness of sheet metal, paint and finish, detail and completeness of components such as wheels, tires, steering wheels, seats, decals, instrument panels, wiring harness, etc.

Originality is to include paint color, fasteners, electrical systems, fuel systems, exhaust systems, mechanical systems, original unaltered serial plates, etc.

Documentation must be typed or computer generated and is to include a one page description of the overall restoration project, an expense report identifying all costs of restoration, photos showing before, during and after. Exhibitors are to provide pertinent information, about the specific tractor restored. This information should include but not limited to an illustration or color photo to depict original colors, paint scheme, cranking instructions, charging instructions, lights and safety equipment, as well as other model options.
